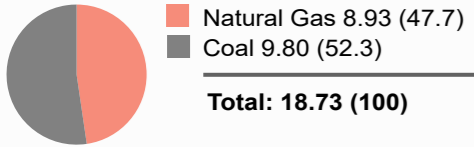

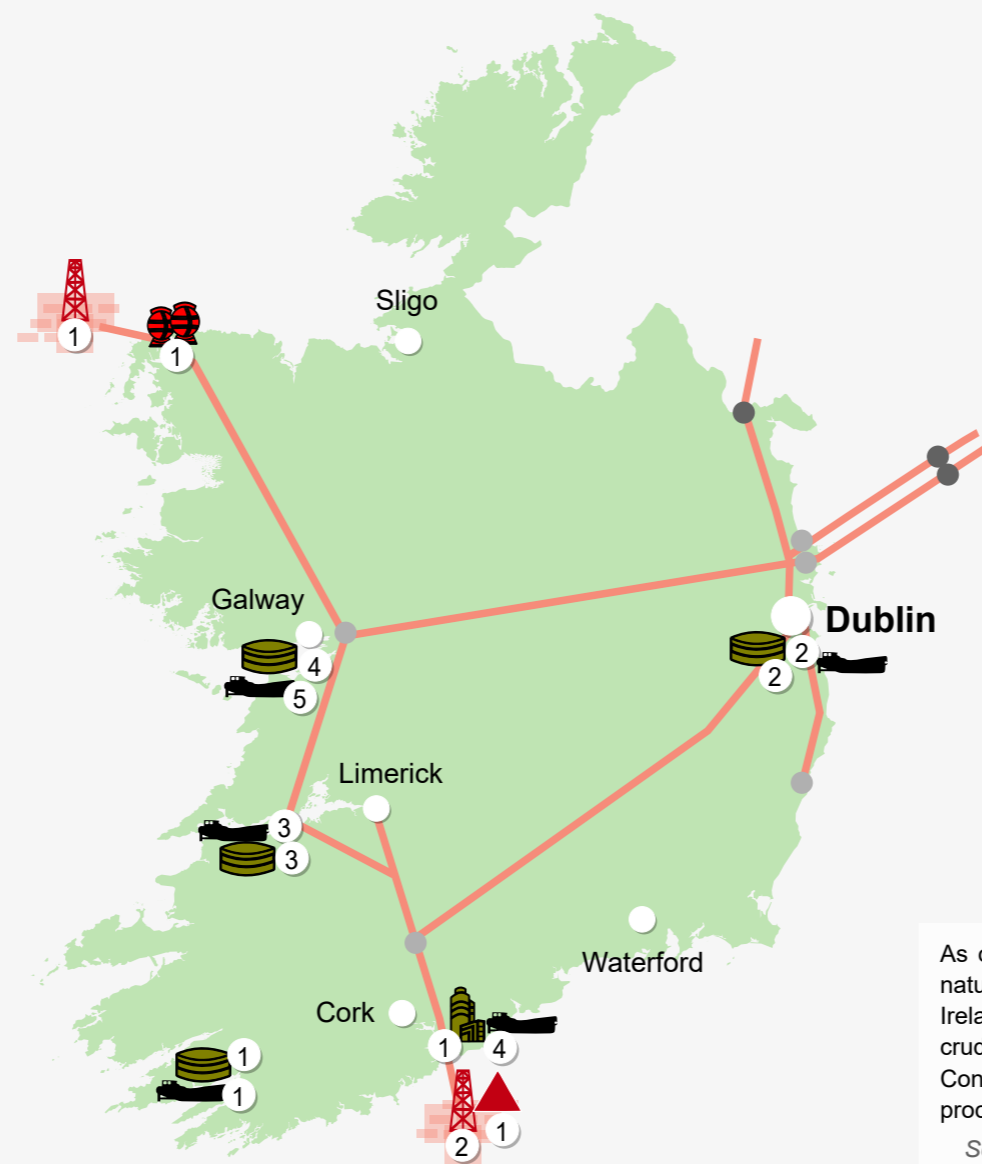

As of 2021 Ireland had 0.35 Tcf of proved natural gas, extracted about 93.7 Bcf of natural gas and 14.0 million tonnes of coal, extraction activity ceased since 1994. Ireland's conventional oil infrastructure include 1 operating oil refinery with a total crude oil processing capacity of 75 000 bpd; some oil terminals and oil storages. Conventional natural gas – include 1 underground natural gas storage and 1 gas processing plant; 2147 km of natural gas pipeline.
