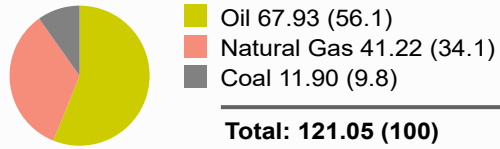


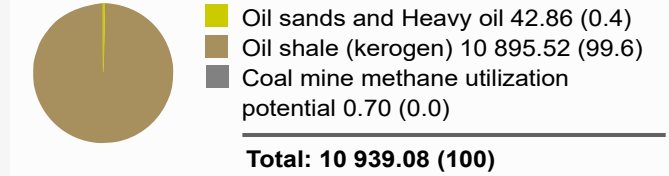

As of 2021 Italy had 497.9 million barrels of proved oil reserves, extracted about 154.1 thousand barrels of crude oil per day, 1.62 Tcf of proved natural gas, extracted about 137.3 Bcf of natural gas and 17.0 million tonnes of coal, extraction has ceased since 2016. Italy's conventional natural gas – include 12 underground natural gas storages; some gas processing plants and more than 10 gas compressor stations; 20 223 km of natural gas pipeline.
